There is a \$75 fee to participate in the Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen Pageant. Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen 2017 will receive \$1000 scholarship, crown, crown pin, plaque, flowers, sash, will ride in the Harvest Homecoming Parade, have appearances during the festival, and compete in the Miss Indiana's Outstanding Teen Pageant in June of 2018.

The First Runner-up will receive \$300 scholarship, plaque, and flowers.

The Second Runner-up will receive \$200 scholarship, plaque, and flowers.

Teen contestants must be 13 by June 2018 and no older than 17 as of July 31, 2018 (17 year olds cannot be graduating seniors in high school unless 16 and graduating early)

Queen advances to Miss Indiana's Outstanding Teen in June 2018.

Queen must ride in Harvest Homecoming Parade and make appearances during the festival.

All money must be claimed within one year from the date awarded.

If the Queen is unable to fulfill all obligations, she must forfeit all prizes, gifts and title to her successor.

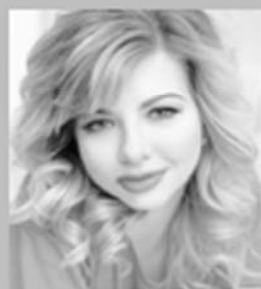

2017 Instructions for Completing the Local Contestant's Resume

This is your opportunity to demonstrate to the judges why they should consider you for the position of Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen. You may list as many or as few items under each category as you desire. This one page, combined with your Platform Statement, and your Local Pageant Contestant Contract will comprise your entire application for the job. The judges will receive your resume exactly as it is submitted. **Do not put your age on the Resume!**

1. Set margins for 1" on all four sides. The font style may not be any smaller than "10" and no larger than "12" point type, using the Times Roman font style.
2. With the justification set for left, type "**Name:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the tab key two or three times. Then, type your name as you wish the judges to know it. (If your name is Mary Deborah Smith and you want to be known as "Deborah Smith", please type "Deborah Smith").
3. Then, move to the next line and type "**Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the tab key two or three times. Then, type the "Local" title for which you are competing.
4. Then, move to the next line and type "**Hometown:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the tab key two or three times. Then type your hometown including the city and the state.
5. Double space down. Type "**Education:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the tab key two or three times. Then type your most recent school first. List in order with the most recent, all schools attended (high school, middle school, elementary school, Pre-K, etc.).
6. Double space down. Type "**Platform Issue:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the tab key two or three times. Type the title of your platform, making sure it lines up with the other information above it. Do not type anything other than the platform title.
7. Double space down. Type "**Scholastic/Career Ambition:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the tab key one or so times. Then type the type of degree/education you would ultimately like to achieve, making sure it lines up with the other information above it. Beneath that, list your career ambition.
8. Double space down. Type "**Talent:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the tab key two or three times. Type the type of talent you will perform and specific selection, making sure it lines up with the information above it. (e.g., Pop Vocal - "Rolling in the Deep", Tap Dance - "Moves Like Jagger", etc.)
9. Double space down. Type "**Scholastic Honors:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the space bar twice. Type your scholastic honors. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
10. Double space down. Type "**Leadership Roles:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the space bar twice. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
11. Double space down. Type "**Accomplishments:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the space bar twice. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
12. Double space down. Type "**Interesting Facts:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the space bar twice. Each item should be separated by a semi-colon (;).
13. Double space down. Type "**Marketing Plan:**" in bold. Following the colon (:), press the space bar

twice. In sentence form, explain how you would market the Miss Local's or Miss State's Outstanding Teen "brand". Please include any relevant experience you have which may uniquely qualify you to serve in this position. Please be aware that a portion of the Miss Local's or Miss State's Outstanding Teen responsibilities includes marketing the Miss Local's or Miss State's Outstanding Teen program to potential sponsors, educational institutions, and organizations.

14. Double space down. Type "**Legacy:**" in **bold**. Following the colon (:), press the space bar twice. This should be typed in sentence form. Please write what your legacy, as Miss Local's Outstanding Teen will be. This statement should answer the question, "A year after giving up your title as Miss Local's Outstanding Teen, what will people remember about your year of service?"

15. Double space down. Type "**Why I should be Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen 2017:**" in **bold**. Following the colon (:), press the space bar twice. This should be typed in sentence form. Explain to the judging panel why you should be selected Miss Local's Outstanding Teen and, more importantly, why you should be selected Miss Local's Outstanding Teen this year.

Important Information Regarding the Contestant's Judges Resume

Please remember that the entire form MUST FIT ON ONE PAGE using the Times Roman font style.

You must leave a 1" margin on all four side of the page. Use your best judgment on what is most important for the judges to know about you. Use your space wisely. Please review the example of what the resume format look like. Any variations from this format will be returned to you and will not be accepted. Your materials will not be retyped. The judges will receive your original work.

CHECK SPELLING AND GRAMMAR!!

This resume, your platform statement, and possibly a local pageant program book will be the only documents the judges will receive about you. By submitting these forms to your local teen organization, you certify that everything on your forms is true and accurate. If it is proven that any information on these forms are not true, correct, and factual, you risk losing your title.

Some spacing issues may arise. Simply follow the example provided. Depending upon the set up of your document, you may need to press the "tab key" fewer or more times than indicated above).

Do not attempt to change margins, font, size options, or deviate from the requested criteria as set forth in this document.

Use plain white paper for the document. Do not use paper with logos, crowns, names, decorations, or other embellishments. It will not be accepted if it is printed on anything other than plain white 8 ½" X 11" paper.

Marketing Plan: I would combine my experience as an intern with a major national marketing firm with my strong belief in the Miss America Organization to establish a three-step plan to market this national program. I would work at educating these corporate and commercial sponsors on the “truth” of our organization. Through meetings with key decision makers within these organizations, I would change their attitudes toward the benefits of partnering with our organization. Finally, I would then “ask for the sale” and demonstrate to them how a joint partnership will further the goals of both organizations.

Legacy: My hope is that in the year of my service as Miss America, I would leave a marked, concrete, and measurable difference in this nation regarding the way we respect each other’s cultural heritage. I hope that through my continued involvement on the national level with the National Conference for Community and Justice that we will hold events at the grassroots level, which not only discuss that topic, but bring about local and state-wide policy changes in which we address cultural diversity in the workplace.

Why I should be Miss Harvest Homecoming’s Outstanding Teen 2017: It is critical that this nation face and embrace its cultural diversity issues and it must be done now. The traditional ethnic make-up of our country is rapidly changing and unless we confront and inoculate the potential conflicts, which might arise, we are headed to potential racial conflicts we have not seen since the 1960s. These conflicts are generally caused by fear and ignorance. Through a nation-wide spokesperson who can give this issue a face and a voice, we can begin the educational process which needs to take place. The reality is that Miss America can have her greatest sphere of influence among our nation’s youth. By placing Miss America in the midst of our nation’s young people, we start the process of changing mindsets and, ultimately, changing the way in which they will treat one another in the future. The issues related to Celebrating Cultural Diversity and Inclusiveness are not just related to race, but also to religion, cultural differences, and sexism. There is no greater role for Miss America than to educate, empower, and embrace the issue of cultural diversity at this point in our nation’s history.

2017 Instructions for Completing the Local Contestant's Platform Statement

Please remember, this **single-spaced 100-200 word** document, combined with your Judges Resume and your Local Pageant Contestant Contract will comprise your entire application for the responsibility of becoming Miss Local's Outstanding Teen. The judges will receive exactly what is submitted. Any items that do not meet the criteria or are submitted after the deadline will not be given to the judges. If your Platform Statement arrives on the day of the deadline, but does not meet the criteria, there will not be time to return it to you; **therefore, it will not be given to the judges.**

Contestants: Discuss your *personal* platform issue. In addition, explain how you will further the Miss "Local's" Outstanding Teen Program and the Miss America's Outstanding Teen Program "brand" to the public.

(See sample Platform Statement.)FYI: The example given is 104 words. You may use up to 200 maximum.

1. Set margins for 1" on all four sides. The font style may not be any smaller than "10" and no larger than "12" point type using the Times New Roman font style.
2. With the justification set for left, type "**Name:**" in **bold**. Following the colon (:), hit the space bar twice. Then, type your name as you wish the judges to know it. (If your name is Mary Deborah Smith and you want to be known as "Deborah Smith", please type "Deborah Smith").
3. Double space down. Set your justification to "center". Then type in **Bold and underline** the title of your Platform.
4. Double space down. Write what you feel is critical for the judge's to know about your platform and why it is necessary for you to have the title of Miss "Local's" Outstanding Teen to promote this issue. What you write will be what the judges know about your platform, your role in successfully dealing with this issue, and the role the Miss "Local's" Outstanding Teen and the Miss America's Outstanding Teen Organizations may play in your plan.
5. Remember to include in the Platform Statement what **you** can do to get the message out and get more of your friends and other teens interested in the Miss "Local's" Outstanding Teen Program and the Miss America's Outstanding Teen Program.

6. Remember to single space the text that you are typing.

7. This essay may include some of the following items (this is not to be meant as an exhaustive list):

- A clear definition of your platform and the specific issues you wish to address
- A plan on how you have or will create awareness of the platform
- The way in which you have or will change attitudes regarding the issue
- The way in which you have or will change behaviors related to this issue
- The way in which your platform issue will move the Miss "Local's" Outstanding Teen Program and the Miss America's Outstanding Teen Program forward
- Your media plans
- Your marketing strategy
- How you propose to fund your ideas/plans
- Any significant accomplishments you have made in regard to your issue.

8. At the bottom of the page, you **MUST** set the justification to the right. Type a line of 26 spaces. Below that line, you must type Signature/Date. Once you have printed the document, you must sign and date this document.

Step 1: When you see “Miss _____ Outstanding Teen”, fill in the blank with *Harvest Homecoming's*.

Step 2: Above “Date(s) of Local Competition”, insert *August 5, 2017*

Step 3: Above “Date(s) of State Competition”, insert *June 2018*

Step 4: When you see ““Miss _____ Outstanding Teen 20____””, fill in the blank with *Harvest Homecoming's*, and *17* to denote this year.

Step 5: Section 2.2

- a. Insert your current age and date of birth

Step 6: Section 2.3.1. Residence Information

- b. Input your complete address and proof of address.

- g. Fill out the information requested on this page to the best of your ability.
- h. Mark which attachments you will include for:

 - b. Documentation for home schooled contestants
 - c. Health and Dental insurance

Step 11: Emergency Contact information

- i. Fill out the information requested on this page to the best of your ability (contestant and guardian together)
- j. Contestants and Guardians should include photo copies of insurance cards along with signing and dating in the designated fields.

Step 12: MAOTeen, Inc. Contestant Social Media Agreement

- k. List out each social media platform which has an active user account (ex: Instagram, Snapchat, Twitter, Facebook etc), and the Username.
- l. Print your name and potential title, *Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen*.
- m. Contestants and Legal Guardians, sign and date in designated fields.

2017 LOCAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

The precepts of conduct for contestants are the foundation upon which the image and reputation of the Miss America program have been built and will continue to be the basis for its operation. Therefore, the Miss Harvest Homecoming Scholarship Pageant board of directors has formalized the following rules, which must be adhered to during the time contestants spend in the Miss Harvest Homecoming Scholarship program.

- Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen contestants will conduct themselves at all times with the dignity, grace and good manners of young women who exemplify the integrity of American youth.

- A contestant will not attend parties, meetings, social events or make public appearances other than those scheduled by the Miss Harvest Homecoming Scholarship Pageant during pageant weekend.
- A contestant will not smoke in public, at the venue, or while being transported between events.
- A contestant will not imbibe in any alcoholic beverages during pageant weekend.
- A contestant will not be in the company of or speak to a Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen Pageant judge except at regularly scheduled Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen Pageant events.
- No visitors, including, parents, family members, sponsors, and friends are allowed backstage to visit any contestant at any time.
- Cell phones or pagers may not be used backstage, in the dressing rooms, or during rehearsals.
- Contestants who are not crowned are released from their contract with the Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen Pageant at the completion of the pageant on finals night following photos.

If a contestant's conduct is deemed unsatisfactory by the Pageant Committee chair, and by this conduct the image and good name of the Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen Pageant is deemed to be jeopardized, the following procedure is followed:

The Director of the Pageant Committee will issue a warning to the contestant in the presence of the contestant's hostess.

If the condition causing the warning is corrected, no further action will be taken.

If not corrected, the Hostess Committee Chair will notify the Executive Director of the Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen Pageant and provide all particulars regarding the infraction of the rules.

The Director and the Hostess Committee Chair will meet with the contestant to discuss the unacceptable conduct.

Notification of the Chair of the Judges and further action could be the result of the decision of the Director and Hostess Committee Chair.

What a contestant does, where she goes, and how she conducts herself while participating in the Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen Pageant, are all governed, to a large degree, by rules, regulations and demanding schedules. Use common sense.

GUIDELINES FOR MISS HARVEST HOMECOMING'S OUTSTANDING TEEN, ALSO REFERRED TO
AS LOCAL TITLEHOLDER'S, YEAR OF SERVICE

Appearances – Booking, Fees, Payments

All appearances for Local Titleholder are arranged and handled by and through the Local Director, as her sole and exclusive agent. The parents are not part of this process. All appearances must have Local Director approval and be chaperoned by Local Director, Pageant/Harvest Homecoming Festival committee member and/or parent/guardian. Local Director maintains exclusive and final decision on all appearances/bookings/events/wardrobe to ensure safety of Local Titleholder and positive standing of the Miss Harvest Homecoming Pageants within the community. Any individual or organization wishing to inquire or book a Local Titleholder for an appearance must contact the Local Pageant Director.

During her Year of Service, Local Titleholder will be required to make a minimum of two (2) appearances per month in furtherance of her Platform and the Local Program as scheduled by her Local Director. In the event Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen should need to cancel a confirmed appearance, she should make said cancellation prior to 24 hours of confirmed time of event.

Local Titleholder should retain her own legal counsel in the event their services are needed during the Year of Service.

Appearances, Meetings and Interviews – Preparation and Conduct

Local Titleholder shall be responsible for doing the necessary preparation for each appearance, meeting and interview. Preparation shall include, but not be limited to, reviewing all information and background material that is provided to her for review, conducting independent research when necessary, and, with respect to appearances, writing her own speeches and specifically targeting them towards the audiences that she will address.

Local Titleholder shall be responsible for having a substantial and appropriate repertoire for talent performances for all of her appearances. If requested to perform, Local Titleholder must provide a set list a minimum of 48 hours in advance of appearance. Set list is to be approved by Local Director. Any and all changes to the approved set list must also be approved by Local Director. Titleholder is not to perform unapproved selections for any reason.

Local Titleholder shall show up on time for all appearances, meetings and interviews. Local Titleholder shall limit cell phone use to emergency situations during appearances, meetings and interviews.

Provided Services and Wardrobe

Local Titleholder shall be well groomed and dress and act appropriately for all occasions. Appearance wardrobe will be sent to Local Director a minimum of 24 hours prior to any appearance for approval. Local titleholder agrees to adhere to approved wardrobe. If changes are required within the 24hr window of any appearance, director must be contacted and secondary wardrobe also approved. For the duration of her year of service, Local titleholder shall not appear in wardrobe unapproved by Local Director for any reason.

Should the Titleholder be given use of additional monies to cover pageant related wardrobe expenses, the following process will apply: Contingent of director approval, this money will be used primarily to reimburse partial or complete cost of competition wear for Miss Indiana's Outstanding Teen including evening gown, talent attire, interview, lifestyle and fitness and/or opening number. Local Titleholder agrees, no single area of competition is to

account for more than half of the total monies awarded. Any exceptions to this require Local Director approval. Any monies remaining after competition wear is completed may only be used to cover expenses at Local Director discretion.

Any service or product received, or otherwise used, by Local Titleholder without prior approval by Local Director will become an expense the Local Titleholder will incur, regardless of allotted monies remaining.

Travel, Lodging and Transportation

Family, friends, sponsors, and others are not permitted to stay overnight in her room, or to accompany her at any appearances, unless approved by Local Director.

Local Titleholder shall stay overnight in the hotel designated and arranged by Local Program for each appearance. Regarding the Miss Indiana Pageant, Titleholder agrees to stay at the host hotel for the duration of the pageant week. If given use of additional monies to cover pageant related expenses, funds to cover hotel cost will be reserved to cover this expense. Smoking and pets are prohibited in any hotel rooms, regardless of hotel policy. All incidental expenses including, but not limited to, hotel telephone, toll charges, room service, and overtime charges related to internet access are the responsibility of Local Titleholder.

Local Titleholder can accrue frequent flier miles during the Year of Service which will be used for her personal travel time during the year. Frequent flier miles will remain Local Titleholder's for use after the Year of Service.

Local Director will serve as a Business Manager for Local Titleholder. The Business Manager responsibilities include advising Local Titleholder of the necessary details of her appearances, and advising her with wardrobe selection for each appearance.

Miscellaneous

During her Year of Service, Local Titleholder shall be a spokesperson not only for her Platform but also for Miss Indiana Scholarship Pageant (MISP). Local Titleholder shall continuously educate herself and be knowledgeable about her Platform and also about MISP, its activities and programs, and specifically its scholarship program, so that she can provide accurate responses when asked.

During her Year of Service, Local Titleholder shall maintain contact with the Local Director at all times. Local Titleholder shall notify Local Director prior to any out-of-state travel which is not in connection with the performance of her obligations as a Local Titleholder. Local Titleholder shall not contact clients, sponsors, business partners or service providers directly at any time.

During her Year of Service or at any time thereafter, Local Titleholder shall not disparage or otherwise make any unfavorable statements, oral or written, or perform any act or omission, which is detrimental to the reputation or goodwill of Local Program or MISP. For purpose of the prior sentence, MISP shall mean MISP, its successors and affiliates and their officers, directors and employees.

Upon winning the title of Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen, Local Titleholder will disclose a full and complete list of any and all personal social websites, along with her screen/user name(s), in which she participates during her year of service. She will use the official social media accounts immediately upon assuming the title. Official social media accounts are property of Harvest Homecoming Scholarship Pageants and Titleholder understands they will be monitored as such. Local Titleholder does not have authority to change passwords on official social media accounts for any reason. Local Titleholder agrees to post any/all appearances within 24 hours. This includes, but is not limited to, Harvest Homecoming Festival events, Miss Indiana's Outstanding Teen events, every sponsor visit/receipt of service, and platform appearances. Titleholder agrees only official Harvest

Homecoming Pageant sponsors will be referenced on official social media accounts. Personal sponsors will be reserved for personal accounts. Upon completing her year of service, Titleholder agrees to refrain from posting any information on any official media accounts.

During her Year of Service, Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen will not seek pageant help, or coaching, from anyone other than her Local Director unless approved by said Local Director. This includes, but is not limited to interview coaching/preparation, stage walking, on-stage question prep, hair/makeup artists, photographers, fitness instructors, etc. All talent coaching/choreography will be approved by Local Director who will have final say on talent presentation. Local Director reserves the right to provide talent coaching/choreography/instruction to Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen other than Miss Harvest Homecoming's Outstanding Teen's personal coach/choreographer/instructor. Local Director also reserves the right to attend any and all preparations including interview workshops or mocks, talent choreography or training sessions, and walking practices in which Local Titleholder participates.

During her Year of Service, Local Titleholder is responsible for representing and marketing MISP and the Local Program in a manner that is designed to (1) reflect the values and standards of MAO, MISP and the Local Program; (2) promote and enhance the visibility of MISP and the Local Program; (3) protect and enhance the image, good name and broad public acceptance of MISP and the Local Program; and (4) increase sponsorship opportunities for MISP and the Local Program.

2017 SCHOLARSHIP RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Miss Harvest Homecoming Pageant Scholarship Fund will award scholarships under the following circumstances:

SCHOLARSHIP USAGE:

It is the responsibility of the contestant to fill out the appropriate Request for Funds form. Any contestant receiving funds has one (1) year from the date of the award to request such funds. Failure to do so will result in the forfeit of said funds.

Scholarship funds may be applied to tuition, textbooks, supplies, academic fees and other appropriate mandatory educational expenses. All unusual or questionable items of expense must be referred to the **Miss Harvest Homecoming Scholarship Pageant Selection Committee** with as much information as possible and far enough in advance for consideration of approval. Amounts received as scholarship payments are taxable income to the extent that they exceed "Qualified Tuition and Related Expenses". Scholarship money may be applied toward expenses related to talent.

Qualified Tuition and Related Expenses include tuition and fees required for enrollment or attendance of a student at an educational organization, including fees, books, supplies and equipment required of all students in the particular course of instruction.

Incidental expenses such as room and, travel, research, clerical help and equipment and other resources not required for enrollment, attendance or for an instructional course may not be considered related expenses and may be includable as taxable income. A contestant should consult a tax adviser to determine if the scholarship payments received are taxable.

Payment of all approved expenditures will be made directly to the accredited institution unless extenuating circumstances exist (with the exception of computer or musical equipment clause). Personal Reimbursements to scholarship recipients will only be honored for academic or talent purposes only, so proper planning and time allotment is essential on the part of the student.

REQUESTING USAGE:

Requests for scholarships are initially processed by the Miss Harvest Homecoming Scholarship Pageant and **for its review and approval** upon written receipt of statements from schools or from the contestant for other educational expenses. All statements and invoices must be accompanied by a cover letter from the contestant.

PRIORITY OF LEVEL IN USAGE:

Contestants receiving scholarships at the state level must use the scholarships won at the local level prior to receiving funds at the state level. Verification must be submitted in writing from the Local Executive Director that all local scholarship funds have been exhausted.

THE MISS HARVEST HOMECOMING SCHOLARSHIP PAGEANT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO AMEND AND OR MODIFY THE FOREGOING SCHOLARSHIP RULES AND REGULATIONS AT ANY TIME WITHOUT NOTICE.
